Having an engaging Go Method Blurb can be a great aid in your recruiting process. Please see a few examples of past blurbs below.

How IT HAPPENS

When writing your blurb remember to include:

- Brief bio
 - Where you're from
 - Prior experience with service trips
 - What you're hoping this experience will be for your team members
- Why you chose to lead a team
- What makes your trip/team unique (why sign up for yours vs. others)

NEXT STEPS

- 1. Reflect on WHY you're leading this team and what's motivating you to serve.
- 2. Write out your blurb in collaboration with your Co Team Captain.
- 3. Send your blurb to our Community Development department.
